sponsors while they play college athletics. We will get used to seeing Aston Martins and Lamborghinis driving near campus. He asked for a show of hands on whether college coaches should be paid huge salaries while the amateur athletes receive no more than a scholarship. There was a difference of opinion on this question, but on the next question about large buyouts for coaches who are not performing to the expectations of the fans, there was no disagreement. He answered several questions from the audience before we adjourned to the nearby Stark Center in the football stadium.

Dr. Jan Todd, Stark Center Director & Chair, Dept. of Kinesiology and Health Education, welcomed us with refreshments and adult beverages. Dr. Todd and other Stark Center staff members led small groups through the Center's archives and museum, one of the lessor known treasures on the UT campus. We learned the history of the Stark Center and H.J. Lutcher Stark who did so much to promote all sports on campus in the early 1900s. When World War One ended, Stark led the fund drive to raise the money to build the original portion of today's D.K. Royal Memorial Stadium.

This was an amazing learning experience for OLLI members who attended this event. We thank the H.J. Lutcher Stark Center and UT OLLI for sponsoring this enrichment program.






IN MEMORIUM Dr. Mark Houston 1944 - 2022

On July 30, 2022, SAGE members lost a respected and beloved teacher, volunteer, mentor, and friend to all. We join Mark's beloved wife Eileen, his daughters, and his many friends and family members in grieving his loss while celebrating his life.

Mark and Eileen joined SAGE in 2014 following Mark's retirement from a long and distinguished career in oceanography and marine geophysics. Mark immediately became an active volunteer, joining the Curriculum Committee and arranging seminars; he served the next several years as Co-Chair of that committee, and was instrumental in creating and leading seminars that have become SAGE institutions, such as Great Decisions and Hot Topics. He conducted a very successful art auction as a fundraiser for SAGE's Excellence Fund.
